First Job out of Grad School:

Prince George's County, Maryland

~District Vehicles provided to all 3 O&M Specialists rather than receive reimbursement for mileage

I thought this was the norm for all O&M jobs!

Horry County Schools, South Carolina

~had always contracted out O&M Services through State School for the Blind, finally decided to hire someone full-time to set up O&M program for the school district

Supervisor who had hired me had no idea what O&M entailed!



- Never occurred to me to ask how I would transport students for lessons
- Provided documentation on need for communitybased instruction during O&M lessons
- Brainstorming Session: Cab? Bus? Driver's Ed Vehicle? Rental Car?
- Created a permission form for parents to sign, based on the forms I had used in Maryland

Seattle Public Schools, Seattle, Washington
 ~First question during interview: "How do you go about transporting students for O&M lessons?"

~Shared permission forms from Maryland & South Carolina with supervisor & tweaked as needed

 Part-time work in 2 other school districts in Washington State
